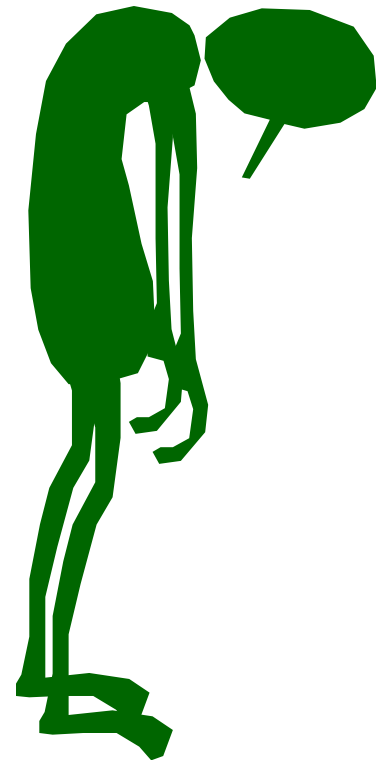

 - “as a group” (6,11,15)

Have you ever felt as though everyone was scheming against you, as though everything was working to bring you down?





The Realism of Daniel 6

❖ Life in the real world

➤ cunning & jealous colleagues (1-5)



➤ careless & bureaucratic management (6-9)

- he didn't check: **“we all agree” (7) !!**
- he didn't think: **“he put it in writing” (9)**
- he was sympathetic **but unable (unwilling?)**
to make exceptions (14)

- changing & transient fortunes (2,3,16,28)

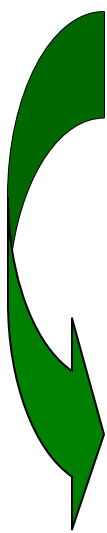


- in the top three (2)

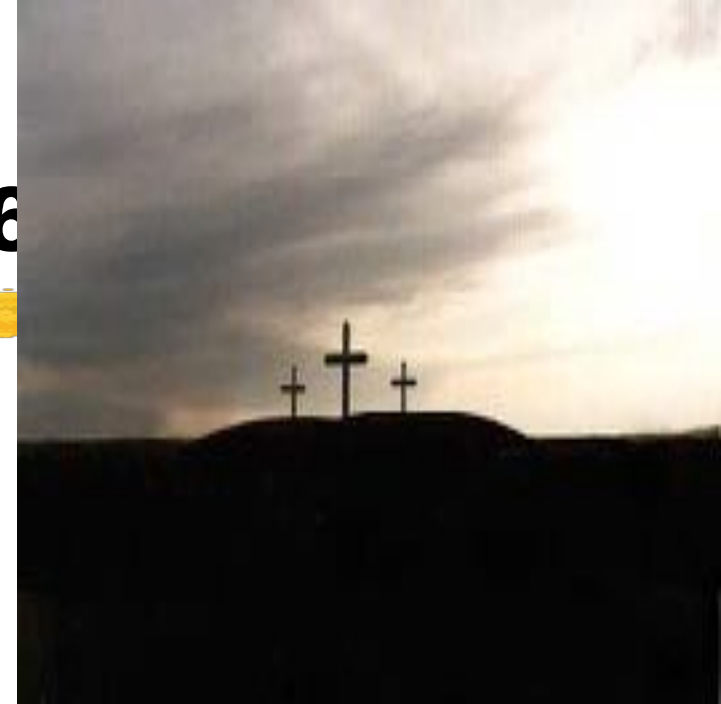

 - Does Daniel 6 promise earthly protection to all who do what is right and trust in God?
 - the 2nd half of the book (e.g. 7:7,21; 8:24; 11:33)
 - the experience of the earliest readers in 2nd century BC Greece
 - the analogy with Jesus' death & resurrection

Jesus' death & Daniel 6

- Betrayal by close associate
- Swiftly changing fortunes
 - Palm Sunday to Good Friday
- A ruler unable (unwilling?) to set Jesus free
 - Pilate & the voice of the Jewish leaders
- Not saved from the cross or the lions' den
- The tomb/pit is sealed with a stone
- Resurrection / saved from the lions

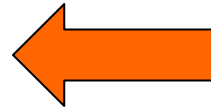

The Invitation of Daniel 6

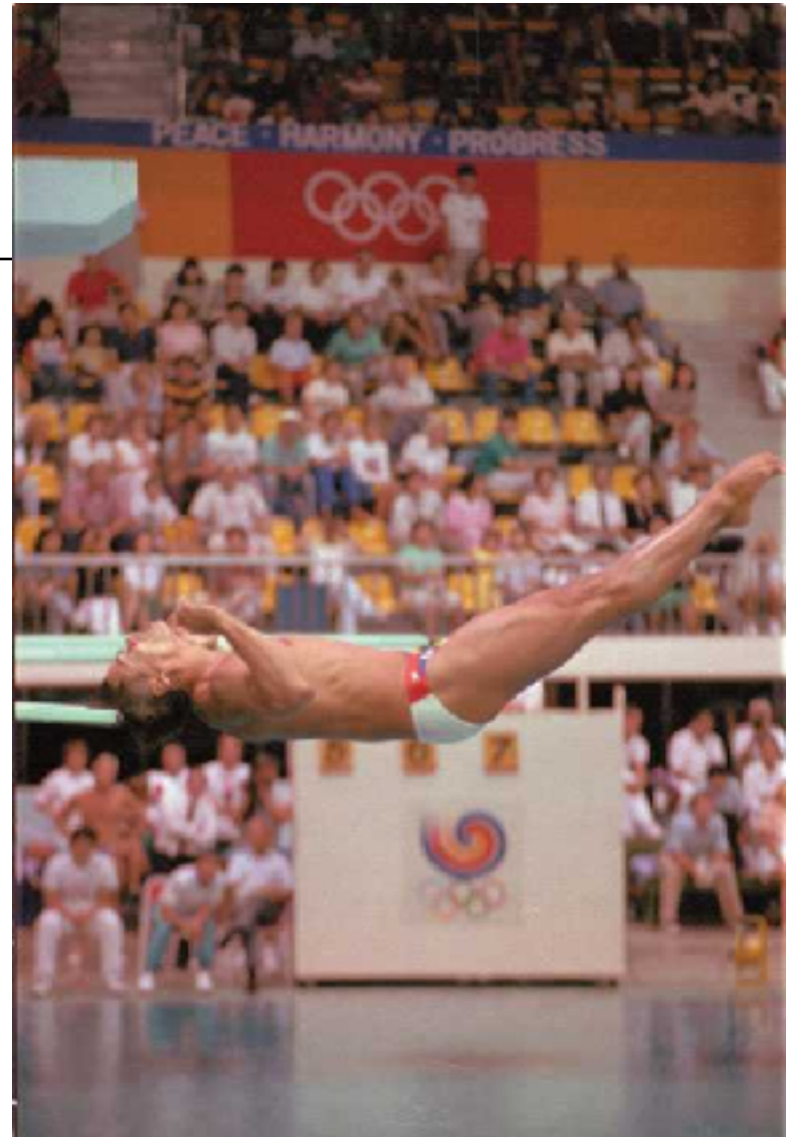


- ❑ Earthly Success without Stain

A Modern Issue to Ponder

❖ Religious Freedom in a Pluralistic society

- A theme in both Daniel 3 & 6
 - Daniel 3: Religious coercion; forced to worship another god
 - Daniel 6: Religious prohibition; forced to offer no prayers to one's own god
 - We need Religious Dialogue without Disrespect


A Modern Issue to Ponder



- ❖ Religious Freedom in a Pluralistic society 
 - protecting religious freedom is a mark of sensitivity and respect
 - protecting religious freedom should not mean prohibiting religious dialogue
 - religious dialogue may invite, but should never impose, conversion

A Modern Issue to Ponder



- ❖ Religious Freedom in a Pluralistic society
- ❖ Religious Practice in a Pluralistic society 
 - displays courage in challenging what is wrong (Dan 6:10)
 - does not “harm” society (Dan 6:22) but keeps it more humane and humble (Dan 3-6)
 - dares to believe that faithfulness to the eternal God is smarter than fearing earthly human powers (Dan 3 & 6 cf. Matt 10:28)

 - What might be examples of Christian faithfulness that are obvious but not obnoxious to your colleagues?
- Is there anything we can do to help each other stand up respectfully for what is right, even if there is the risk of serious reprisals?
