The Vision in Daniel 7

- Scene 1: four beasts arise from the sea (2-8)
- Scene 2: God ("the Ancient of Days") sits on His throne in judgement (9-10)
- Scene 3: the four beasts are judged (11-12)
- Scene 4: a human figure comes on the clouds to receive an eternal kingdom from God (13-14)



 - Babylon, Media, Persia?
- 3 kings?
 - 3 Babylonian kings?
 - 3 Persian kings?
- John Calvin's wise warning: "Those who understand three definite kingdoms by the three ribs seem to refine far too minutely."

After that, I looked, and there before me was another beast, one that looked <u>like a leopard</u>. And on its back it had <u>four wings</u> like those of <u>a bird</u>. This beast had four heads, and it was given authority to rule.

The Interpretation of the Vision

After that, in my vision at night I looked, and there before me was a fourth beast-- <u>terrifying and frightening</u> and very powerful. It had large iron teeth; it crushed and devoured its victims and trampled underfoot whatever was left. It was <u>different</u> from all the former beasts, and it had ten horns.




The Monster who Ruins

- The 4th beast (verses 7-8, 19-26)
 - a cruel and terrifying leader (7,19)
 - "different from the rest" (7,19,23)
 - no animal analogy
 - active verbs
 - destroyed (11-12)
 - much worse!! (2 feet, 3 ribs, 4 wings, not 5 but 10 horns!!)

A Terrifying Monster!

The 4th beast (Verse 25)

CRIPPLEB Bungladeshi worker Mohamad Bashar, 24, stranded in Singapure for more than three months, may be going home soon.

- Though you may not be able to change the monsters, do not succumb to them. Do not let them change you.
 - Do not succumb by becoming a monster yourself!



The Master who Reigns

- God seated on His throne (9-10)
 - the "ancient of Days" = GOD
 - "clothes white as snow" = purity, dazzling glory
 - "white hair" = eternal, wise (not old and weak!)
 - "fire" = power, purity, judgement
 - "open books" = judgement, justice

GOD in control: powerful, pure & just



The Letters and Diaries of Etty Hillesum 1941–1943

"Very well then, this new certainty, that what they are after is our total destruction, I accept it... I have come to terms with life.. And the funny thing is, I don't feel I'm in their clutches anyway .. I don't feel in anybody's clutches; I feel safe in God's arms... and I shall always be able to stand on my own two feet even when they are planted on the hardest soil of the harshest reality."

The Man who Receives (verse 13)

There before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven... He was given authority, glory and sovereign power ...

His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed.

Who is this "son of man"?

Who is this "one like a son of man"?

- Jesus in the New Testament
 - Jesus is the Man who comes on the clouds (Mark 13:26)
 - Jesus is the holy human (Adam) par excellence (1 Cor 15:45; Rom 5:15)
- But how would pre-NT readers understand the Daniel 7 vision?

<u>Vision</u> — <u>Interpretation</u>

• In the vision of verse 14, it is the one "like a son of man" who receives the everlasting kingdom.

• In the interpretation of verse 27 (also verse 18), it is "the saints, the people of the Most High God" who receive the everlasting kingdom.

The Man who Receives

- The human coming on clouds (13-14)
 - "like a son of man" = a human being
 - "coming on the clouds" = the hero who conquers chaotic sea monsters

The hero is human (not beastly)!
Faithful people of the Most High God
will reign for ever, not powerful beasts or
tyrannical monsters

The way the chapter ends

- "This is the end of the matter. I, Daniel, was deeply troubled by my thoughts, and my face turned pale, but I kept the matter to myself." (verse 28)
 - A warning of the <u>harsh realities</u> of life
 - Men who Rule & Monsters who Ruin
 - The Master who Reigns & the Man who Receives
