THE WORLD

Let us pray for Nepal during this period of unrest. May God calm the fear and anger in people's hearts with His peace, and grant the nation's interim leaders wisdom, courage, and resources to guide the country toward fair and just elections. We remember the families who are grieving and those who are injured or displaced. We lift up the Deanery of Nepal and the Church across the country, praying that believers would be firmly rooted in Christ, protected as they gather, and empowered to serve their neighbours in need. We especially commit their Dean, Revd Prem Tamang, into God's care as he leads the flock through this challenging season. May the Church shine brightly with the love of Jesus, bringing healing where there is division, and pointing many to the unshakable hope found only in our Lord, Jesus Christ. Pray for the Gulf states and their surrounding region during this time of heightened tension. May the Lord grant wisdom and restraint to national leaders and security forces, that they would seek peace and justice rather than retaliation or violence. Lift up the relationships between neighboring nations, asking for reconciliation where trust has been strained. Pray for God's grace to prevail, bringing peace and healing to an already troubled world.

SINGAPORE

As Singapore hosts the World Para Swimming Championships 2025 from 21–27 September at the OCBC Aquatic Centre, we remember our fellow citizens, both young and old, who live with disabilities. Our Lord loves each one the same, and every life is precious to Him. Let us pray that, as a society, we would grow in embracing and integrating people with disabilities—offering them dignity, opportunities to learn and develop, and the chance to find fulfilment in vocations suited to their gifts. We also lift up the Championships event and pray for the safety of all participants, for good weather, and that every swimmer would be able to give their very best. May their efforts bring encouragement, joy, and glory to God.

DIOCESE

September marks our Diocesan Education month. Let us pray for our school principals and senior leadership team, that they may have wisdom and courage to lead the team in fulfilling our education mission and in promoting Christian values in our schools amidst changing societal values. Pray for the well-being of our teachers and support staff as they labour tirelessly in their roles and responsibilities; for the chaplaincy teams in their ministry among students and staff, and that God will open doors of opportunity for them to share the Gospel. 




