

First Sunday of Advent 28 November 2021

Advent refers to the coming of Christ.

The church remembers the first Advent as described in Luke 1, culminating in Jesus' birth, and we look for His coming in glory, Jesus' second coming, with great anticipation.

In the church calendar, we set aside the four Sundays before Christmas to focus on this coming of Jesus.

The liturgical colour for Advent is purple which signifies royalty, suffering and repentance – themes which are revisited at Lent.

The Advent Wreath contains five candles and is placed on the Communion table in the Sanctuary as a visual reminder to us that the Lord will surely come again. He came the first time to save us from our sins and He will come again to judge the living and the dead. He will take charge as the King of kings and His kingdom will have no end.

On the first Sunday of Advent, the first purple candle (which represents Hope) is lit.

Our soul waits for the LORD; he is our help and our shield. (Psalm 33:20. ESV)

What Is Advent?

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "coming," which is a translation of the Greek word *parousia*. Scholars believe that during the 4th and 5th centuries in Spain and Gaul, Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians at the January feast of Epiphany, the celebration of God's incarnation represented by the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus (Matt. 2:1), his baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist (John 1:29), and his first miracle at Cana (John 2:1). During this season of preparation, Christians would spend 40 days in penance, prayer, and fasting to prepare for this celebration; originally, there was little connection between Advent and Christmas.

By the 6th century, however, Roman Christians had tied Advent to the coming of Christ. But the "coming" they had in mind was not Christ's first coming in the manger in Bethlehem, but his second coming in the clouds as the judge of the world. It was not until the Middle Ages that the Advent season was explicitly linked to Christ's first coming at Christmas.

Advent Today

Today, the season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. Advent 2021 begins on Sunday, November 28, and ends on Friday, December 24. The new Christian year begins with the twelveday celebration of Christmastide, which lasts from Christmas Eve until Epiphany on January 6, 2022.

Advent symbolizes the present situation of the church in these "last days" (Acts 2:17, Heb. 1:2), as God's people wait for the return of Christ in glory to consummate his eternal kingdom. The church is in a similar situation to Israel at the end of the Old Testament: in exile, waiting and hoping in prayerful expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Israel looked back to God's past gracious actions on their behalf in leading them out of Egypt in the Exodus, and on this basis, they called for God once again to act for them. In the same way, the church, during Advent, looks back upon Christ's coming in celebration while at the same time

looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ's kingdom when he returns for his people. In this light, the Advent hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" perfectly represents the church's cry during the Advent season:

O come, O come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

While Israel would have sung the song in expectation of Christ's first coming, the church now sings the song in commemoration of that first coming and in expectation of the second coming in the future.

Advent Liturgy and Practice

To balance the two elements of remembrance and anticipation, the first two Sundays in Advent look forward to Christ's second coming, and the last two Sundays look backward to remember Christ's first coming. Over the course of the four weeks, Scripture readings move from passages about Christ's return in judgment to Old Testament passages about the expectation of the coming Messiah to New Testament passages about the announcements of Christ's arrival by John the Baptist and the Angels.

While it is difficult to avoid holiday celebrations, shopping, lights and decorations, and joyful carols, Advent is intended to be a season of fasting, much like Lent, and there are a variety of ways that this time of mourning works itself out in the season. Reflection on the violence and evil in the world, especially the COVID-19 pandemic, causes us to cry out to God to make things right—to put death's dark shadows to flight. Our exile in the present makes us look forward to our future Exodus. And our own sinfulness and need for grace lead us to pray for the Holy Spirit to renew His work in conforming us into the image of Christ.

PRAYER HIGHLIGHTS

THE WORLD

According to the World Health Organisation, Europe remains "in the firm grip" of COVID-19 and if the current trend persists, the death toll could top 2.2 million this winter. The increase could be due to a combination of factors such as the contagious Delta variant, the lack of vaccination and the relaxation of safe management measures. Pray for God's merciful intervention in this crisis, for swift government action and for a disciplined public who will support government measures to effectively curb and contain the rapid spread of the virus. Pray for the health care systems in European countries which are under extreme stress to cope with the rapid increase in cases, for the protection of healthcare workers and for the recovery of those who have been infected.

SINGAPORE

Finance Minister Lawrence Wong highlighted the need to "acknowledge and do our best to address the legitimate concerns of different communities without allowing our politics to be based exclusively on identities or tribal allegiances".

Pray that we will heed the call to tackle tribalism and identity politics and that each one of us will play our part to build a strong, resilient and cohesive Singaporean identity, regardless of our race, language, religion or ideologies.

DIOCESE

Deanery of Vietnam

Pray for the Lord to protect and preserve the congregants and leaders as they face a rampant rise of COVID-19 infections in Vietnam, especially in Ho Chi Minh City during this time; for God's help to raise a younger generation in committed discipleship and godly leadership. Pray also for divine wisdom in identifying, encouraging and training the indigenous leaders for the deanery (extracted from Diocesan Missions Report 2021)

Pray for good planning and organisation of this service and for God to richly supply all needed manpower and other resources. 

The tradition of Nine Lessons and Carols is popularly associated with King's College, Cambridge. However the original service was held in a wooden shed, which then served as the cathedral in Truro, on Christmas Eve 1880.

The Nine lesson readings tell of God's redemptive purpose by recounting the fall of humanity, the promise of the Messiah and fulfilment of the promise with the birth of Jesus from the book of Genesis to the Gospels



In 2019, the AGM approved a major restoration of the Cathedral Nave, covering the plaster and painting of the external and internal walls of the main building and transepts, various repairs and electrical works. Since then, over \$5,000,000 has been raised towards the restoration. In June 2021, Cathedral appointed the contractor to undertake the works, which will start in January 2022 and take up to 12 months.

After considering the health and safety of the congregation and challenges to maintaining sanctity of worship under restoration conditions, the PCC together with the Mandarin Congregation Church Council (CC) decided to close the Nave during the restoration works.

The PCC and CC considered alternative sites for worship services. Some options involve significant costs, and possible continued restrictions to on-site worship due to COVID-19 added uncertainty. The PCC and CC working together, decided to exercise financial prudence, and use existing Cathedral facilities for worship services during the Nave closure.

We have sought to maximise the number of worshippers who can safely attend our onsite services, and we are pleased to announce that based on current Safe Management Measures we will be able to welcome up to 200 worshippers for each service in the Pavilion and the Cathedral New Sanctuary.
