Joshua successfully led the Israelites to cross the Jordan and inherit the Promised Land, a place flowing with milk and honey (Exodus 3:8), and at the end of Joshua's glorious career, we were told, "Israel served the Lord all the days of Joshua, and all the days of the elders who outlived Joshua and had known all the work that the Lord did for Israel" (Joshua 24:31). Besides leading the Israelites to inherit God's promises, Joshua led them to faithfully serve God and worship Him in his generation and the generation after him. While we are wowed by the faith of the Israelites that lasted two generations, sadly, this amazing trend didn't last.

"And all that generation also were gathered to their fathers. And there arose another generation after them who did not know the

Lord or the work that he had done for Israel. And the people of Israel did what was evil in the sight of the Lord and served the Baals. And they abandoned the Lord, the God of their fathers, who had brought them out of the land of Egypt. They went after other gods, from among the gods of the peoples who were around them, and bowed down to them. And they provoked the

Lord to anger. They abandoned the Lord and served the Baals and the Ashtaroth" (Judges 2:10-13).

I am sure that we are shocked by the outcome and have questioned what had happened that resulted in the loss of one generation. I don't think we will ever know the real reason, but there are similar challenges we face today as we think of the next generation in our midst – a different worldview, a different

experience of God, and the lack of role models.

George Barna, professor with Arizona Christian University. shown that person's worldview is often in place by the time they reach the age of 13 (Barna Group, 2019) and in a research conducted by the Barna Group of nearly 2,000 teenagers aged 13 to 18 years old between 2016 and 2017, the

researchers found that spiritual maturity ranks low on the list of priorities for most Gen Z* (Barna Group, 2019). While there are many different theories on the change in the worldview of our young people on spirituality, the questions we need to ask is what shapes their worldview? And what role are we playing in shaping their worldview?

It should not be surprising that a large proportion of the Gen Z in church, are second, third, or even fourth generation Christians. Growing up in a Christian family does not imply that our children will automatically have a personal faith and relationship with Christ. The truth is, many are trying to make sense of the faith that their parents believe in. While our children seek to make sense of their faith. as parents, we can certainly do more to help them to know God. God gave parents a simple instruction on discipleship at home. "These words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise" (Deuteronomy 6:6-7).

Lastly, we need to ask if we are our children's role model. Last weekend, I preached on how we are to be salt and light in the marketplace. We must certainly consider

how we can be salt and light at home to our children. Our children today are looking for role models who can show them how to live out an authentic faith in a world filled with deep and dark challenges. It's a daunting task, but enabled by God, nothing is impossible.

As we celebrate Youth Day (3 July 2022), let's commit ourselves to prioritise the next generation, let's pray for them and work to disciple them well so that they may know God and remain faithful in serving Christ for the generations to come.

Do also join me in welcoming Revd Andrew Yap who starts his posting with us from 1 Jul. He will oversee the Sat 5.30pm and Sun 7.30am services. Do keep him and his family

in prayer during this period of transition and you can certainly look forward to interact with him as he goes to preach at the different services next weekend!

Faithkids 1 will continue its online programme due to the lack of suitable facilities within the Cathedral premises and in the surrounding vicinity at the particular time of its programme. We will explore other options for Faithkids 1 to return onsite. In the meantime, we hope that the online children programme may help to cater to the spiritual needs of those children who are not ready to return onsite.

With the onsite resumption of the children's programmes, our monthly Holy Communion Service for Families with Children will cease from July 2022. We encourage parents to bring their children to attend the services on every last weekend of the month where there is no children's programme.

It is our desire that through our weekend children's programme i.e. CityKids, Faithkids 1 and Faithkids 2, we can bring children of the same age group across all the English services together to form meaningful friendships and grow spiritually as a community. 40.day 2022

TO LIVE IS CHRIST

aul's letter to the Philippians is the subject matter for this year's 40.Day prayer. Paul loves all his churches alike. But he expresses his love and longing for the Church in Philippi more than any other. It is his least troublesome, most generous, and most lovable church. In the midst of their own poverty and pain, they gave beyond their means in support of Paul and the poor and needy in Judea. Philippians is, in fact, a thank you letter. And much more besides.

Not all is well with the Philippi Church. Externally they are facing a low-grade persecution. Internally they are running a low-grade fever. There are bouts of envy and rivalry, discord and disunity, vainglory and selfish ambition, and more (1:15-17, 27; 2:1-4; 4:2). Their condition is not yet critical. But these and other symptoms are alarming.

In this letter, Paul diagnoses the causes of the Philippi Fever: They have shifted

from the centrality of Christ. They have lost their grip on the Gospel. And they have forgotten the Future that God has prepared for them through the Incarnation, Humiliation, and Exaltation of Christ.

Philippians is not only the diagnosis but also the cure for all that ails the Church in Philippi: Rejoice in the Lord in the midst of suffering. Stand firm as one in the face of opposition. Live as citizens of heaven in the city of Philippi. Work out your salvation in fear and trembling. And live every moment of today in the light of God's Perfect Tomorrow. In other words, to live is Christ.

What ails the Singapore Church?
Covid-19 has taken a toll. But only by exasperating faults that were already there. Philippians is both a timeless and a timely word for the post-pandemic Church in the city-state of Singapore.
A cure for all that ails us. If only we will listen, pray, and obey.

Update on Nave Restoration Works

The Scaffolding has been erected at the North East side of the building and is expected to reach the North west side (West Porch) in 2 weeks' time.

Inside the Nave, removal of the hollow plaster areas has begun along the columns and walls from about 2m upwards. Mapping work for hollowness at the higher areas from the base of the arches are in progress. Removal of the plaster at these higher areas will commence once

the proposal is seen and approved by the consultants.

Works on rising dampness are in progress. These are carried out at the water point areas found at both the entrances to the North and South Transepts.

While work has been progressing slowly due to various reasons including a shortage of workers, we understand that the contractor will be allocating more workers to the project going forward. We expect work to pick up from June with more workers working at both the external and internal of the building.

Please pray for God's favour over the restoration – for more skilled workers to be available, a safe and peaceful environment for the work to continue, minimal disruptions and distractions from internal and external sources, and wisdom and practical abilities for the project teams





to give of their best to this work. "Unless the LORD builds the house, the builders labour in vain" applies very much to the restoration of this building.





