THE VICAR WRITES

⁴⁶Then King Nebuchadnezzar fell upon his face and paid homage to Daniel, and commanded that an offering and incense be offered up to him. ⁴⁷The king answered and said to Daniel, "Truly, your God is God of gods and Lord of kings, and a revealer of mysteries, for you have been able to reveal this mystery." (Daniel 2:46-47).

ive times in the Book of Daniel (Daniel 4:37), Nebuchadnezzar the greatest king of Babylon, a pagan worshipper, honoured and praised God. Nebuchadnezzar was famously known for his military campaign and construction projects. He was the greatest king of the Chaldean dynasty and he had conquered Syria, the Palestinian countries, and Israel, and turned Babylon into a prosperous city. As part of his military campaign, he had destroyed the Temple of Jerusalem and forced the Jewish people into exile. It was during his reign that Daniel was given high honours and many great gifts, and was made ruler over the whole province of Babylon and chief prefect over all the wise men (Daniel 2:48). Together with his good friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego they served in Nebuchadnezzar's court while remaining faithful to the Lord.

He prided himself on his achievements. "Is not this great Babylon, which I have built by my mighty power as a royal residence and for the glory of my majesty?" (Dan 4:30) and it was also obvious that he was not a man who feared men or god. So, what had caused Nebuchadnezzar, a pagan king, known to

be a tyrant and a ruthless conqueror to bow his heart and face to worship God? Nebuchadnezzar had witnessed the power of God through Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. Daniel and his friends had refused to defile themselves with the king's food and wine, and emerged stronger (Dan 1:8-21). Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego had refused to bow down and worship the golden image of Nebuchadnezzar (Dan 3:8-15), and God delivered Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego from the fiery furnace (Dan 3:16-18). Moreover, Daniel carried out his duty and responsibility relying solely on the power and wisdom of God (Dan 2:19-23; 31-45 & 4:19-27).

Most of us work in the marketplace and we have colleagues, superiors and bosses who are pre-believers. How do we carry ourselves as witnesses for Jesus Christ? What can we learn from the faith and life of Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, in drawing our pre-believing colleagues and bosses to experience God, and for them to bow their hearts and face to God? Pray and ask God for His Holy Spirit to empower and enable you to be a faithful witness for Jesus Christ in the marketplace.

Due to the F1 Singapore Grand Prix 2022, the following services will be cancelled:


1 Oct, Sat - 4 pm, 5.30 pm 2 Oct, Sun - 4.30 pm

Heavenly Father, we continue to thank You for Your faithful love for us that never ends and Your mercy which never ceases. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness.

Lord, You are God. You created the heavens and earth and put everything in place. You made the world to be lived in, not to be a place of empty chaos. You are our Lord and there is no

other. Thank You, Father, for being a wall of fire and protection around our congregations, families and those involved in the restoration of our Cathedral Nave building. We seek for God's Kingdom to come and God's will to be done on earth as it is in heaven, for the Cathedral Nave restoration project. We know that You will make our thoughts agreeable to Your will, so that the plans for this project may be established and succeed.

We continue to Praise and Thank You, Father in Heaven, for the progress that has been made in the past weeks. We thank You for blessing us with a steady stream of competent general workers and skilled labourers, who through their weathered hands and perspired foreheads, show their dedication to the work involved. We have commenced plastering works at the East Side. Plastering works to the North Side will commence next week. Bricks surface preparations towards the West Porch are in progress and it will be followed shortly by the plastering works. We continue to seek You, Lord, for the availability of all materials needed for the ongoing works.

The erection of the scaffold at the bell tower is now at its ¾ mark. It should reach the top within the next 2 weeks. We pray, Lord, for the safety of the scaffolders as they complete the scaffolding to the bell tower. Scaffolding works will commence inside the Nave in October.

We lift up the main contractor, Shanghai Chong Kee Furniture & Construction Pte Ltd, and all subcontractors, vendors and consultants, and all their staff and workers, unto You. Protect them, Lord, from the evils of rushing, complacency, and distraction that may cause unnecessary injuries. Give them the ability to know the dangers before them, and the alertness and skills to avoid them.

We continue to pray for Your favour Lord, over the restoration – for skilled workers to be available, for a safe and peaceful environment for the work to continue with minimal disruptions and distractions from internal and external sources, and wisdom and practical abilities for the project teams to give of their best to this work. "Unless the LORD builds the house, the builders labour in vain" applies very much to the restoration of the Cathedral Nave.





