THE VICAR WRITES

REVD CANON DR LEWIS LEW

onathan Edwards (1703-1764), J preacher and scholar who later became a President of Princeton University, was a prominent leader in a revival movement which came to be called the Great Awakening as it spread through the communities of New England and the pioneering settlements in America. Converts to Christianity reached 50,000 out of a total of 250,000 colonists. The years of 1734-35 saw an unusually powerful move of God's Spirit in thousands of people. Edwards described the characteristics of the revival as, first, an extraordinary sense of the awful majesty, greatness and holiness of God, and second, a great longing for humility before God and adoration of God (Waugh, 2011).

The story of Jonathan Edwards reminds us of our colonial past. We are indebted to the missionaries from London Mission Society and others who have obeyed the call of God to proclaim the Gospel in our tiny red dot. As missionaries landed on our shore, God planted St Andrew's Cathedral to be where it is today 200 years ago. "St Andrew's Cathedral is the second church building on the site of the original Church of St Andrew, a location selected by Stamford Raffles in 1823" (NLB, 2023).

The story of Jonathan Edwards also reminds us of the Charismatic Renewal which took place here in Singapore. In 1972, God poured out the Holy Spirit on mainline Christian denominations in Singapore. St Andrew's Cathedral was very much at the centre of God's mighty move and revival in Singapore. Through that the Holy Spirit revived countless lives, and many souls were added into the Kingdom of God. Clearly, God has a plan when He planted St Andrew's Cathedral in where we are today.

I was so emotionally moved when I saw the picture on The Straits Times (10th March 2023). What caught my attention were the vast number of government, institutional, and commercial buildings that surrounded

St Andrew's Cathedral. It's so rare to get a pictorial perspective of where God has placed us. I was immediately reminded of John 9:5, Jesus said, "As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." God has placed us in the world, to be the light of the world. What an amazing opportunity to be the witnesses for Christ in the Centre Business District of Singapore.

As we celebrate this important milestone (200 years of church planting and 50 years after the Charismatic Renewal), we need to continue to pray for REVIVAL in our land, and we need to RECAPTURE the vision of why God planted us in the heart of Singapore.

THE WELCOME CENTRE

"See, I have set before you an open door that no one can shut."

Revelation 3:8

We are thankful to God for blessing the Cathedral with the Welcome Centre – a special space set apart to be His open door for all to enter to encounter Him. By God's grace, He brings us together as the church to work out His purpose for it. By faith, we look to Him to lead us on.

Based on the study undertaken by a Taskforce in 2021 on the use of the Welcome Centre in the post-Covid season, the PCC had considered members' feedback received, the financial position, the functional and ministry aims of the Welcome Centre. A resolution was then passed to cease the commercial operations of the Cathedral Cafe. Subsequently, a working committee was commissioned last year to prepare for the Welcome Centre reopening.

Being an integral part of the Cathedral, the Welcome Centre's purpose and use are decidedly aligned with the Cathedral's focus on discipleship and evangelism, and with the Diocesan's call to obey the Great Commandment (Matt. 22:36-40) and to fulfill the Great Commission (Matt.28:16-20). We envision the Welcome Centre to be a place of blessing to both the public and members – an oasis offering rest and respite from the activities, cares and busyness of life and work. Those who enter are welcomed with warm hospitality and a friendly chat or listening ear

over a complimentary cup of coffee/tea in a comfortable setting. For those with pastoral needs, attentive care is extended and the follow-up by specific ministries to help with such needs.

It is our heartfelt prayer that our Lord Jesus will draw many to encounter him with the spirit refreshed, the soul restored, the heart encouraged with hope through fellowship, and lives saved through the sharing of the good news. May it be a space where the Cathedral family can come together to share life to bless each other, and to serve to bless the community.

With several major renovations in progress on the Cathedral ground, there is a significant limitation of space. Consequently, the Welcome Centre is now used as staff workspace, a place for meetings and ministry. The eventual reopening of the Welcome Centre is closely dependent on the completion of these renovations. We hope to share more updates along the way as the work progresses.

Last year, North Korea fired a record-breaking number of missiles and declared it was it was an "irreversible" nuclear power. Last week Pyongyang test-fired its most powerful intercontinental ballistic missile and President Kim Jong-un has called for the scaling up of weapons production to increase his country's nuclear arsenal. These were in response to the largest US-South Korea joint military drills in five years. ELECTORAL ROLL

Members who wish to vote at the AGM must be on the Electoral Roll (ER) of St Andrew's Cathedral. Baptised members who are at least 17 years of age, confirmed in the Anglican Church, regularly attending Service and partaking Holy Communion in the Cathedral, are eligible to be on the Electoral Roll. Members may check if you are on the Electoral Roll by submitting the ER Enquiry Form, and update your particulars by submitting the Membership Update Form.

FEBRUARY 2023 UPDATE ON NAVE RESTORATION WORKS

We praise and thank God for the arrival of the lime plaster materials. The removal of plaster and brick repair works at the Bell Tower is nearing completion, and plastering works to the repaired wall surfaces using the lime plaster will now take place in the coming weeks. Priority will be given to the Bell Tower as we hope to finish the works to the Bell Tower in the earliest possible time. A small team of plasterers will concurrently work on the external walls of the Transepts where the walls are ready to be plastered and painted. Removal of plaster and brick repair works at the

West Porch is nearing completion, and we hope to have additional plasterers coming onsite in the coming weeks to work on the completed areas. Painting works to the offices on Levels 2 and 3 of the South Transept should be completed soon, after which the painters will move on to paint the external areas where the walls are plastered and ready.

We are also looking into the rainwater discharge system at the Bell Tower. Whenever there is heavy rainfall,

the rainwater overflows into the belfry and into the ringing chamber. We hope to address the issue by creating more discharge outlets at the belfry level, where the rainwater is collected and dispersed through the existing discharge system. We hope to increase the flow rate of the discharge water, as well as minimise the collection of rainwater at the four corners of the Bell Tower.

Within the Nave, the trenches are ready and the M&E works are in progress. The airconditioning pipes are presently being laid. Once completed, the electrical works will commence together with the laying of cables for the AV and IT systems.


The Cathedral team continues to work closely with the main contractor on site operation matters. As we work towards the completion of the restoration project, we continue to pray for the timely provision of the scaffold materials

needed for the rest of the Nave; for the safety of all workers and the technical team, especially when working at heights; and for good weather, so as all works can continue smoothly and safely.

We also continue to pray for the Lord's favour over the restoration: for skilled workers to be available; for a safe and peaceful environment for the work to continue with minimal disruptions and distractions from internal and external sources; and for wisdom and practical abilities for the project teams to give of their best to this work.

"Unless the LORD builds the house, the builders

labour in vain" applies very much to the restoration of the Cathedral Nave. In Jesus Name, we pray. Amen.


