

THE WORLD

CHINA

Over a period of 40 years, China succeeded in lifting 800 million of its citizens out of poverty. [World Bank]. It has built up extraordinary expertise in many areas, especially in transportation infrastructure connecting countries and peoples, which will expand economic opportunities for many and contribute to the reduction of global poverty and the uplifting of many peoples.

Pray that God, in his great mercy for this ancient civilisation, speaks directly into the hearts of the Chinese people, as only He knows how. Let them find their true Creator God, who is also the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Pray for God to strengthen His people in this great and beautiful country with true wisdom, overcoming faith, and the knowledge of His will, and may His Spirit spread like Holy fire afresh across this land. *"All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations shall worship before you." (Psalm 22:27)*

SINGAPORE

In 1978, Billy Graham called out Singapore as the Antioch of Asia. Today, there are 2694 people groups in Southeast Asia, of which almost 950 groups are unreached and/or unengaged. [Salt and Light]

Ask God to forgive us for our human failings and plant His strategy in the hearts of the leadership of our churches. Pray that all Singapore churches will be an Antioch church like that in Acts 13, and each church will fulfil His special call to impact the nations with Christ's love. Together, in the unity of the Spirit and in the bond of peace, Singapore Antioch churches will move forward in praying, giving, and sending in obedience to the Spirit's leading.

DIOCESE AND CATHEDRAL

In 1856, (before there was a Diocese) Revd William Humphrey preached a sermon on Pentecost Sunday "...that the congregation of St. Andrew's must, in spite of itself, become a Missionary congregation, — a centre of diffusing to others the light, and comfort, and peace of the knowledge of Christ and Him crucified". Pray that today, St Andrew's Cathedral, as the mother church of the Diocese and its 6 Deaneries, be faithful to God's call to be His witnesses, sharing the grace and love of God to the people groups in Singapore and beyond. Let us seek to be the channel for God's blessing to reach many for the glory of God.

Also in 1856, the foundation stone for today's Cathedral was laid and her first service was held in 1862. Pray for the restoration of the Nave which is ongoing, for more specialized workers to complete the finishing touches; for the electrical and aircon installation that has started; for diligence, skill, and perfect coordination of all required resources. Pray for the Lord's guiding and protective hand over all involved in the project, including protection over their families and loved ones. May the restoration of His physical cathedral and the land be ready to serve the purposes of God in our generation and until He returns.

Pray God's Spirit will do a deep work in each one of us – as His people, we will humble ourselves, pray, and seek His face and turn from our wicked ways ...and God will hear us, forgive our sins and heal this land. Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith. (Hebrews 12:1-2)

Restricted Vehicular Access to SAC due to National Day Parade (NDP) 2023

MAY 2023 UPDATE ON NAVE RESTORATION WORKS

God is good, all the time. Really!!!

Despite the uncertainties over the past few months and notwithstanding the concerns over SCK's recent moratorium application, God continues to see us through, time and again. The Nave restoration works are continuing, and even as SCK works on the prospective scheme of arrangement to be proposed as part of the restructuring of the company, SCK remains committed to seeing through the completion of the restoration of the Cathedral Nave. We raise our hands unto Our Father in Heaven in thanksgiving and praise, as He continues to watch over this project daily. Thank you so much, Lord.

We have seen good progress in April to the following:

- Internal works Following the erection of the scaffold from the Nave all the way to the reredos:
 - Wall plaster The workers are busy removing sections of hollow wall plaster and carrying out repairs to damaged bricks, cracks and hollow sections.
 - Electrical Works The trenches are in place, and the laying of cables in the Nave will commence this week.
 - Graham White Library The workers have completed laying the air-conditioning pipes, and the electricians are now laying the electricity cables for the library and the rooms.


- 2. Bell Tower The contractor is targeting to complete the works at the top section of the bell tower by the end of May. The lightning protection works to the tower are underway, together with metal repair works around the steeple. This will be followed by the painting works, and after that, the scaffold at the top will be removed after a final inspection to confirm that all the works in this area have been completed.
- 3. **Plaster Works** The workers have commenced plastering works at the lower end of the East Windows and along the south side of the Nave, and painting works to these areas will commence once the final lime plaster coat has been applied.

We continue to pray for the Lord's favour over the restoration –

- for smooth work progress and the safety of all workers and the technical team, especially when working at height;
- for good weather, so that the works can continue smoothly and safely;
- for skilled workers to be available;
- for a safe and peaceful environment for the work to continue with minimal disruptions and distractions from internal and external sources; and
- for wisdom and practical abilities for the project teams to give of their best to this work.


