THE VICAR WRITES

REVD CHRISTOPHER CHAN

or many years, an annual Easter Eve memorial service had been centrally coordinated by the Diocese of Singapore for members of our parishes. In March 2025, parishes were informed that this practice would cease from this year onwards, with low participation rates cited as a key reason for the change. In place of the centralised diocesan memorial service. parishes were encouraged to help their members remember dearly departed loved ones through a time of thanksgiving and prayer during their Easter Eve or Easter Sunday services.

The Cathedral leadership recognises the importance of an organised time for the remembrance of our dearly departed. Rather than incorporating this into our worship services on Holy Saturday or Easter Sunday, we believe that it would be preferable to hold a standalone memorial service. After some deliberation, it was decided that this would be conducted in early November, keeping in mind that 2 November 2025 is All Souls' Day, also known to Anglicans as the Commemoration of All Faithful

Departed. The observance of All Souls' Day began with the Roman Catholic Church, but it is a valid expression of Anglican spirituality. This day may be observed in connection with the doctrines of the resurrection of the body and the communion of saints, which we affirm through the Apostles' Creed.

This year, St Andrew's Cathedral's memorial service for the faithful departed will be held at All Saints' Memorial Chapel on Saturday, 8 November 2025, at 2.00pm. In due time, members will be invited to register for this service and provide relevant details of their dearly departed loved ones. We trust that this memorial service will be a meaningful time for us to remember those who have gone home to be with the Lord.



PRAYER HIGHLIGHTS

THE WORLD

Pray for Indonesia, where unrest has spiralled into violence, fuelled by public frustration and hardship. May God's presence be in the midst of this turmoil, bringing calm and peace. May He guide the nation's leaders with wisdom and clarity as they respond to cries for justice. We ask the Lord to provide for the economic needs of the people, especially the poor and vulnerable. We pray for the Church in Indonesia that it may bring comfort to those who are suffering, and proclaim the love and peace of our Lord and Saviour to all who are seeking rest and restoration. We also pray for the people of Afghanistan who experienced one of the deadliest earthquakes early this week. May God's grace and love be upon this nation even as rescue efforts continue. We ask our heavenly Father to provide field hospitals, shelter, food, and clean water for the survivors, and that many more will be rescued. May the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, guard the hearts of the Afghan people in this time of deep sorrow and need.

SINGAPORE

There has been a rise in physical crimes in our nation, with many youths also being drawn in. May the Lord watch over Singapore and protect all who live here. We pray that God will grant wisdom to our leaders, law enforcement, and community groups, that effective measures may be put in place to address these challenges. We lift up our youths, asking that they may find guidance, purpose, and supportive communities that lead them away from wrongdoing. May God's peace and protection rest upon our

homes, streets, schools, and public spaces, so that Singapore may remain a safe and secure place for all.

DIOCESE

Church of the Epiphany

Pray for a smooth transition as the church undergoes a change of church leadership in October; for God's abundant financial provision to settle the outstanding costs for the newly renovated church building and for the spiritual and numerical growth of members of the Tamil, English and Chinese congregations.

Chapel of the Holy Spirit

Pray for the 2026 church theme "Sowing the Gospel Seed" (John 12:24), as the church prepares to go further for the lost and deeper in the Lord. Pray for a total dependence on the Lord, for apart from Him, the church can do nothing.

CATHEDRAL

We pray for the wellbeing of our Cathedral members, especially those who are struggling with personal issues and health problems. May they look to the Lord at all times, holding fast to His comforting assurance that He has engraved them on the palms of His hands and they will never be forgotten (Isaiah 49: 15-16). May they also find encouragement through the support of brothers and sisters in Christ who will journey alongside them through prayer and practical assistance. We pray that during these trials, their hearts may draw closer to God, trusting in His presence, finding strength in His promises and remembering that "The Lord is near to all who call on Him, to all who call on Him in truth" (Psalm 145:18).




LEGACY GIVING
