THE VICAR

PRESS ON - Have you been discouraged by negative remarks from people when you have put in much effort to your work? I am sure we have experienced that at some point in our lives. The people of God had to face nasty criticisms from their enemies, "what they are building—if a fox goes up on it he will break down their stone wall!" (v.3). Sanballat and Tobiah had tormented them to discourage them from rebuilding the walls. But instead of being discouraged, the people of God pressed-on together as one people. "So we built the wall. And all the wall was joined together to half its height, for the people had a mind to work" (v.6).

Their enemies intensified their attacks. They "plotted together to come and fight against Jerusalem and cause confusion in it" (v.8). That forced the people of God

to near breaking point. They became weary, "the strength of those who bear the burdens is failing. There is too much rubble. By ourselves we will not be able to rebuild the wall" (v.10). For some of us, this may be too much to bear, especially when the testing and challenges become too much to bear, and this may become the point of giving up. But instead of giving-up, the people of God pressed-on to rebuild and to defend the city of Jerusalem, both at the same time. "Those who carried burdens were loaded in such a way that each labored on the work with one hand and held his weapon with the other. And each of the builders had his sword strapped at his side while he built" (vv.17-18).

You may be wondering why I have chosen to focus on the above stories on how the people of God overcame the most difficult challenges in this month's Vicar's Write. For many of us we may have started 2021 with great hope and aspirations. But the last one month has been filled with nothing but bad news after bad news. Some of us may be in distress and are already wondering how are we to survive the next eleven months?

Through the two stories, I hope that in this season we can press-on to overcome discouragement and challenges together as a community. And we can press-on by holding-on tightly to God when the going gets tough - for *"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling. There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns"* (Psalm 46:1-5).

THE WORLD

Myanmar

Pray for law and order to be restored in Myanmar after a military coup seized power from Aung San Suu Kyi's democratically elected government on 1 Feb, and replaced 24 ministers and deputies with 11 in its new administration. Pray that due process will be observed for allegations of election fraud and there will be a full and fair hearing for the matter to be justly decided. Pray also for the release of those detained unlawfully, for the state of emergency which had been declared to be lifted and for political stability to be restored to the country. Pray against disruptions to the economy and to telecommunications; for the safety of the people and the preservation of their livelihoods, in the midst of an already very challenging pandemic.

SINGAPORE

Pray for our Minister for Sustainability and the Environment Grace Fu and all Ministers involved in the multi-ministry effort to address climate change and promote sustainability under a Singapore Green Plan 2030. Pray that the government's 3P Partnership (People, Private & Public sectors) will enable the community to come together and do more together; to co-create sustainable environmental solutions that promote ownership of our environment. Pray for divine wisdom to build on past policies and programmes, pull the different strands together to attain a common, united vision and achieve concrete targets.

Pray for the safety and well-being of the PKH National and Expatriate staff team, including Susan Goh, Deborah Teo and Joyce Carino, the 79 young men and women and 192 children which have returned to the 4 PKH locations. Pray also for the other young people and children who have yet to return to PKH, that they will soon be able to do so and that everyone may experience the tangible expression of God's love through the staff and teachers.

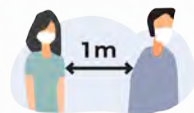

Archbishop's Message

REMAIN FAITHFUL

Greetings to you in the Priceless Name of Jesus! The world has both witnessed and encountered one of the most challenging times in human experience in 2020. As God's Church, we have however, much to be thankful for.

We thank the Lord and celebrate the faithful and fruitful ministries of Bishop Rennis Ponniah and Bishop Datuk Ng Moon Hing, who have both retired as Diocesan Bishops of Singapore and West Malaysia respectively. At the same time, we rejoice and welcome Bishop Titus Chung Khiam Boon who was consecrated and installed as the 10th Bishop of Singapore on 18th October 2020. We congratulate and welcome the appointment of Bishop-Designate Revd. Canon Dr. D. Steven Abarrow as the 5th Bishop of West Malaysia. Praise the Lord for His goodness and faithfulness to us!

As we celebrate God's faithfulness towards us, we remember the words of Jesus exhorting us to remain faithful to the end. 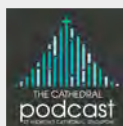

SAC RESTORATION WORKS PROJECT, 2020-2022



This Project aims to repair and restore various parts of the Cathedral's historic building that have succumbed to environmental wear and tear. The Restoration Works will involve re-plastering and re-painting of interior and exterior walls, timber carpentry, stone works, metal works, electrical works, plumbing and roof works. The Project is expected to take 3 years. The cost of \$6million will be paid out from the Cathedral Heritage Fund (CHF) set up to fund this Project as well as future heritage and building works.
