Jesus said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." Luke 5:4

We are familiar with the account of Jesus' encounter with some of the fishermen-turned-disciples in Luke chapter 5. They had toiled all night without any catch. In obedience to Jesus' command "put out into the deep", they let down their washed nets again and had a bumper catch.

The Latin phrase *duc* in *altum* - "put out into the deep" - can be a prophetic rallying call. We need to move out of the shallow brackish waters of our comfort zone into the roiling deep waters of a fast changing late post-modern and early *post* post-modern (!) world.

It is both a pastoral and missionary call.

In being pastoral, we have an eye on and a caring heart for the needs of our flock. The needs will range from felt ones like loneliness, fear and spiritual dryness to more intellectual needs like questions about the faith, questions arising from existential experiences of suffering or the rod lightning issues of the day such as social inequality, LGBT etc. Without over labelling, obviously the needs depend on one's life-cycle and exposure. Those who are younger and more in tune with today's educational and cultural formation will be more sensitive to some issues. Those who were brought up in the culture of yesteryears will have a different set of pre-suppositions. The interactions across the cultural sections are also keenly felt in families and some of these needs can be vicariously felt.

Using the words of Paul in Colossians 1:28, are we able to "proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with

all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ"?

The warnings of the Parable of the Sower (Matthew 11) are not just for new-Christians but applicable for the life-span of a Christian. For some, are the effects of the seeds of the Word, having grown some roots, being removed or choked? Are Christians quietly lapsing in their faith because questions are not being addressed, the presence of life-faith dissonance or the creeping and gripping effects of sin, snuffing out every sense of God's presence in one's life?

As for **missionary**, this is about evangelism and civic engagement. Are we willing to "put out into the deep" and be engaged with the seeking questions that dissatisfied citizens of today's world are asking? Going into the deep will of course include our more traditional ways of incarnational mercy giving, where we quench physical thirsts before sharing the Gospel. But incarnation includes walking into the world and sharing the same table as "publicans and sinners" (Jesus in Mark 2:16) or like St Paul in Areopagus (Acts 17:16-34), being able to share the Gospel on their grounds. Indeed, what are the tables and grounds of today?

We recall the words of Jesus: "I will build my Church and the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it." (Matt 16:18). It seems like the Church is on the defensive and often we retreat into our own cultural and intellectual bubbles or echo chambers. But this promise is about the Church advancing and boldy (but lovingly) gate-crashing hellish parties. Are we able to? Are we willing to?

Will we gird up our loins (Ephesians 6:14) and duc in altum?

PRAYER HIGHLIGHTS

THE WORLD

Japan

Japan is the largest un-evangelised nation that is completely open to missionaries. Due to spiritual, socio-cultural, linguistic and financial difficulties, to be an effective minister of the gospel is a long, hard process of adaptation. Pray for greater cooperation among the mission agencies, which are mainly involved in church planting and evangelism but are seeing little fruit; Pray for strategic insight, the Holy Spirit's anointing and for fruitful collaboration.

Pray for Christians who can teach English to go to Japan as tentmakers as they are in high demand. Pray also for long-term missionaries who are the greater need because of the years needed to acquire the language and understand the culture. Over a million Japanese live abroad. Every year, over 1,600 return home having encountered Jesus, many with a missional burden for their homeland. Many struggle to integrate into the native church scene. Pray for ministries helping returnees to reintegrate into Japanese life and for returning Christians to have a major impact on church life. (Source: Operation World)

Transboundary Haze

Pray that the Ministers of ASEAN countries will stand together with firm resolve, to implement effective measures that will put a stop to the recurrence of transboundary haze. Pray for good organisation as they work together to extinguish the raging fires which are mainly in Riau, Jambi, South Sumatra and Kalimantan. Pray for rain and for strong winds to divert the haze away from inhabited areas. Pray for protection against respiratory diseases and greenhouse gases that cause climate change.

SINGAPORE

Singapore is heating up twice as fast as the rest of the world because our humidity is high all year round. Our maximum daily temperatures

could reach 35-37 degrees Celsius by 2100, if carbon emissions continue to rise at the same rate (Meteorological Service). High temperatures could lead to heat exhaustion and heat stroke resulting in organ damage and fatalities. Pray for God's mercy and grace to be upon this tiny island, for divine wisdom and timely measures to be taken by those in authority to mitigate the trend of rising temperatures.

DIOCESE

Clergy (Overseas Assignment/Sabbatical and others)

Pray for our clergy who are on overseas assignments or on sabbatical; that God will surround them and their families with His love and protection, renew and refresh them in His presence and strengthen them through His Word.

Retired Clergy

Pray for our clergy who have recently retired, that God will grant them grace to adapt to this new season in their lives. Pray that they will discern God's plans for them and gain new perspectives for their lives and their continued contribution to the Body of Christ. Pray that God will open doors for them to mentor our younger generation of leaders.




