his Bicentennial has been a very special year for many of us. We have looked back. We have researched. We have dug up hidden "artefacts." I echo the feelings of those who have worked hard in the past: we have been richly blessed by the lives of those who have come before us.

It wasn't difficult at all; if not a huge privilege; for us to write, tell and sing of them. Our mission and motivation at working hard at the Bicentennial Christmas Carol Services; including the publication of a special edition of the Courier; were simple: we needed to tell *their stories* well, that our Father may be glorified. And after that, we recede into the background. For the real heroes and heroines are not on our stages, pulpits or pews today. They are long gone. To bask in their glory

would have diminished the very stories we are attempting to tell.

In the process, what lessons can be drawn from these historical observations?

US" Think of the Christian faith of some of our **English** forebears which formed their values and shaped the way they seeded our society. While there are some truths about how the imposition of a Western world view has its own ills (i.e Edward Said in his magisterial book Orientalism), a belief in a God of Creation should underline our conviction that every culture at every season needs to be challenged by His revelation through Word and Creation (Psalm 19); even if

at times, this had to come through another culture.

The English Reformation in the 16th century and the flowering of education (through breakthroughs in printing) led to a Christianisation of a nation where almost every child needed to study Greek and Latin in schools through catechisms where Biblical truths were carefully taught. The same education finally led to the abolishment of slavery: we should be familiar with the heroic efforts of William Wilberforce. Stamford Raffles was a very close friend of William, and they lived as neighbours. Raffles shared some of these values and permitted Christian missionaries to serve in the earlier years of our city.

Another lesson to be drawn is the authentic unity that was forged "in the trenches" of the war years. Both Changi Prison and the Cathedral served as hubs

for Christians of every stream. Today
the Church has undoubtedly
benefited from the wealth
of the city and has gained
significant social standing.
Unlike our counterparts in
the war years — who were
literally disrobed and stripped
to their bare bones — today,
church leaders meet under very
different circumstances, often
adorned in glorious array.

My last word shall be this: that we need to drop the celebrity culture and consider what being Christ-like means. We would certainly honour our forebears if we love everyone equally, as Christ has commanded us. These include people of other faiths and closer home, Christians from different streams need to respect one another.

We have sung about them. By His grace, let's also live like them.



PRAYER HIGHLIGHTS

THE WORLD

India

Violence has erupted in India's norther eastern state of Assam as protests grew over a new citizenship law which allows for the fast-tracking of citizenship applications from religious minorities from three neighbouring countries, but not Muslims. It is feared that this new legislation will grant citizenship to large numbers of immigrants from Bangladesh who are accused of stealing jobs and diluting the region's cultural identity. Violent clashes between protestors and police have led to physical injuries and fatalities. Pray for the government of India to act with wisdom and speed to address this critical situation, to alleviate the fears of the people and to restore peace to the land.

New Zealand

Pray for God's comfort to be upon the bereaved families who lost their loved ones during the recent volcanic eruption on White Island, New Zealand and for His healing hands to be laid on those who are suffering from burns to their skin and lungs.

SINGAPORE

At the recently concluded UN Climate Summit in Madrid, Singapore's Minister for the Environment and Water Resources Masagos Zulkifli, remarked that this Summit was "a reminder of the importance of support for multilateralism as a key framework, for diverse countries to jointly advocate common causes such as climate change, free trade and peace". Pray that Singapore will continue to play an active role on the global stage, in advocating a "common objective of safeguarding our planet for future generations" and that countries will implement effective and timely measures to tackle the challenges ahead.

Christmas Celebrations

Pray that all over Singapore, in Orchard Road, in churches and in every nook and

corner, the true message of Christmas will be boldly proclaimed. Pray that the hearts of hearers will be illumined and their eyes opened, to the God of love who became incarnate in Christ that He may die for the sins of the whole world. Pray for the powerful anointing of the Holy Spirit on every Christmas message, that lives will be touched and drawn to the saving grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

DIOCESE

Clergy (Overseas Assignment/ Sabbatical and others)

Pray for our clergy who are on overseas assignments or on sabbatical; that God will bless and prosper the work of their hands, renew and refresh them in body, mind and spirit and strengthen them in their times of communion with Him.

Retired Clergy

Pray for our retired clergy to have new direction and new purpose for their lives; they will be recharged like Caleb, to advance God's Kingdom and aim to finish well, the race He has set before them. Due to protracted wet weather, we will be closing the East Lawn carpark during some weekends during this period. We apologise for inconvenience caused. Please park at nearby carparks:



SAC RESTORATION WORKS PROJECT, 2020-2022

This Project aims to repair and restore various parts of the Cathedral's historic building that have succumbed to environmental wear and tear. The Restoration Works will involve re-plastering



and re-painting of interior and exterior walls, timber carpentry, stone works, metal works, electrical works, plumbing and roof works. The Project is expected to take 3 years. Its cost of \$6million will be paid out from the Cathedral Heritage Fund (CHF) set up to fund this Project as well as future heritage and building works.
