A Communal Communion?

he dispensation from Bishop, which he mentioned in his sermon, was released on 28th July and we print it here below. I have written a Vicar Writes on the meaning of the Holy Communion which I hope you will take some time to reflect on.

We have received some good feedback on the experience of Holy Communion at home. One powerful aspect of the Lord's Supper is the communal experience of breaking bread and praying together, something which is difficult to achieve in our large Services. The Last Supper was conducted in the context of a communal meal for a small gathering and this continued in the life of the early church. Over the years, this has become a tightly guarded church practice, no

by Paul's doubt cautioned cautions (see 1 Corinthians 11:17ff) and to avoid superstitious practices. would We expect today's Singaporeans to be un-superstitious but alas, in some circles, it has become so. We can understand clergy's Bishop's and our cautious approach in as expressed dispensation. That said, how we approach the practice of home communion depends a lot on our hearts and attitudes and it is a precious discipling moment as we take responsibility for our worship and fellowship with one another.

Dispensation on the Forms of Administering Holy Communion

Based on the rationale and teaching presented in the paper on 'Holy Communion in COVID Conditions' (dated 4 July 2020), and aided by a Study paper by Bishop-Designate Canon Dr Titus Chung and team titled 'Proposal for the Breaking of Bread by a Church Community that is Connected by Electronic Means' (4 June 2020) which was discussed at various leadership platforms:

We, the Bishop of Singapore, grant a Dispensation for parishes and congregations in the Archdeaconry of Singapore to practice one or more of the following three forms of administering Holy Communion during the period 2 August 2020 to 31 October 2020 to address the extraordinary situation posed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Holy Communion Service to a congregation that physically gathers in a manner that satisfies the safety standards specified by the national authorities for religious organisations.
- 2. Holy Communion by extension from a common table, whereby Diocesan authorised persons distribute preconsecrated elements to dispersed households or small groups at their respective locations using a simple worship liturgy.
- 3. Holy Communion through an Online Service with Good Controls to a Congregation that is electronically present and connected. (See Section II.C of the Teaching paper dated 4 July 2020).

May all things be done with faith and love, and in good order to exalt the Lord and strengthen His church for missions and ministry.

FOR CONGREGATIONAL WORSHIP SERVICES (CWS)

These weekly Holy Communion Services are said for up to 50 Cathedral Worshippers.

Each Service will be for an hour and they will be held in the Nave. Worshippers may attend individually or in groups of not more than 5 each.

Sat : 11.30am in Mandarin : 4.30pm in English

Sun : 7.30am in English : 9.30am in Mandarin : 11.30am in English : 2.30pm in Mandarin

Wed: 12.30pm in English

Thu: 12.30pm in English

In the interest of safety against Covid-19,

all worshippers (including their vehicles) are to arrive at the church premises not earlier than 30 minutes before the start of a Service, and leave the premises not later than 30 minutes after the end of a Service. Worshippers must be masked during the Services.

Seniors (70 years and older)

are not yet encouraged to come to church to attend Services. They are advised to join in the Cathedral's weekly on-line Services. They can also contact the pastoral team of their Services to request for Holy Communion to be administered to them at home.

Admission to these Services will be by tickets only, free of charge.

Please book your CWS tickets at https://cathedral.org.sg/page/cws or by phoning 63376104. For Services in Mandarin please call 63392435. Bookings for CWS will open at 1pm a week before the Service; they will close at 1pm a day before the Service.

There will not be on-site worship Services on Saturday (8 August) and Sunday (9 August).



Pedestrian and Vehicular Entry / Exit: Worshippers who are entering the church grounds on foot are to do so only at the MRT Gate (the pedestrian gate next to the Welcome Centre / Café) and leave by the same Gate.

Safe Entry and Temperature checks will be conducted after the MRT Gate.

Worshippers who are driving into the church grounds are to do so only at the SRC Gate

(the vehicular gate facing the Singapore Recreation Centre) and leave by the Padang Gate.

For these worshippers, Safe Entry and Temperature checks will be conducted near the West Door of the Cathedral.

Entry into the Cathedral Nave is at the West Door (ie main door) of the Church.

ie the West Door. The 2 doors leading into the North and South Transepts are for exit only.

FOR PRIVATE WORSHIP (PW)

Worshippers may enter the Nave for personal prayer.

They may do this individually or in groups of not more than 5 each, and they must be masked at all times.

The Nave is available for PW from Tuesdays to Fridays, 10am to 4pm.

Each session is for 30 minutes, starting on the hour. Please phone 63376014 to book an appointment. Subject to the availability of space, walk-ins may be permitted.

All who come for PW will enter the church premises at the MRT Gate

(next to the Welcome Centre / Café). There will be no entry to vehicles; drivers are advised to park their cars in the carparks outside the cathedral.



SAC RESTORATION WORKS PROJECT, 2020-2022



Project aims to This repair and restore various parts of the Cathedral's historic building that succumbed have environmental wear and Restoration tear. The Works will involve re-plastering and painting of interior and exterior walls, timber carpentry, stone works, metal works, electrical

works, plumbing and roof works. The Project is expected to take 3 years. The cost of \$6million will be paid out from the Cathedral Heritage Fund (CHF) set up to fund this Project as well as future heritage and building works.

In this Covid-19 pandemic, members of the Cathedral have gone out of their way to bring tangible relief to others in their difficulty.

Project Completion Report:

RELIEF WORK TO MIGRANT WORKERS

At the start of the Circuit Breaker period, the Cathedral partnered Crisis Relief Alliance(CRA), to alleviate the pandemic situation in a number of the 110 factory-converted dormitories where migrant workers (mainly Indian and Bangladeshi) were being attended to by the CRA medical teams. With the financial support raised from members, we were able to provide each worker with a whole-fruits pack and snacks/care pack each week.

On 31 July, we completed this relief work of providing supplies to the dormitories.

Estimated cost of this project was \$200,000

Total actual cost for this work for 15 weeks amounts to \$209.993.60.

All contributions collected through the SAC-CRA Covid-19 Relief fund have been fully disbursed. This special account will soon be closed. We would like to thank all who contributed their funds, personally delivered the supplies to the dormitories and shared their efforts which made this relief work possible.

LAZARUS MINISTRY

The mission of the Lazarus Ministry is to bring hope, enable the destitute and homeless to return to their feet and rediscover their purpose in life through acts of kindness and the love of Christ. Lazarus Ministry is named as such to remind those



of us who are more well that we should never forget the needs of the poor at our doorstep.

From inception in late 2018, the Lazarus Ministry had been in contact with around 20 different rough sleepers including Singaporeans and migrant workers and has kept consistent contact with 7 of them and over various periods of time.

The small team of dedicated, and compassionate volunteers has been tirelessly plying the areas around St Andrew's Cathedral, befriending rough sleepers and journeying with those who are open to receiving help to improve their lives. We reach out by befriending, supplying listening. and physical provisions which all serve the deeper end of bringing of hope in Christ. It is through the transforming power of the love of God that a person would be truly be able to stand on his own two feet.
