### THE VICAR WRITES



#### THE PRIESTING OF MOSES ISRAELI

We are looking forward to the Ordination Service on Sunday at 5.00 pm, where our very own Revd Moses Israeli will be priested. He has been pastoring our Myanmar Worship Service (MWS) for many years now and with his priesting, he will be able to serve Holy Communion in that congregation, amidst his many other duties.

Moses started off with working for CITY Community Services. Jovial, respectful and responsible, he is well loved by his colleagues. He then went on to work on his theological degree at Trinity Theological College and he graduated in 2019. Last year, he was jointly ordained to the ministry of a deacon by his Archbishop from the Province of Myanmar, Stephen Than and our bishop. It is a unique arrangement and reflects the close partnership between our diocese and the Province of Myanmar.



Under his leadership and pastoral care, MWS has been growing steadily. Various forms of outreach were also carried out to connect with and reach foreign or domestic workers who gather or picnic on our grounds. MWS works closely with our BMW ministry (Befriending Migrant Workers) in these.

MWS also plays an important role in bringing a measure of unity between the various Myanmar ministries in Singapore. They often work together in joint outreach projects. The presence and ministry of the MWS community is important for the Myanmar community here as a whole and this is not just for those who are Christians.

Recent issues arising from the pandemic have highlighted the plight of foreigners in our midst, especially those who are of the lower income group and only working here for a season. SAC has a special ministry to the Myanmar community, a vision started under the previous Dean, Bishop Kuan Kim Seng. This is a calling which we need to continue to embrace as we adjust to a "scattered season."

This Ordination Service is an important milestone For Revd Moses, his family and the MWS community. Please continue to keep him and his wife, Nay Nay Aung Nyein and their daughter, Naw Isabelle Mya (8 years) and son, Saw Immanuel Mya (2 years) in our prayers.

#### THE WORLD

#### **Thailand**

Last Sunday at least 10,000 democracy activists gathered in Bangkok. They were demanding a new political order and questioned the legitimacy of the present government. demonstrators are asking for a new Constitution and for human rights protection. They say they will keep gathering if their aims are not met. Pray that the people's concerns will be heard by the government and for a good resolution to the unrest through peaceful negotiations. Pray that these demonstrations will not erupt into violence and bloodshed. Pray that the government and the people will work together to help Thailand recover from the economic downturn which has led to millions of job losses.

#### **SINGAPORE**

#### Partial resumption of cross-border travel

The Reciprocal Green Lane which allows Malavsia and Singapore residents short term travel for essential business and official purposes and the Periodic Commuting Arrangement which allows Singaporeans and Malaysians or permanent residents who hold long term immigration passes to travel to either country for business and work purposes, were implemented on 17 Aug. Pray that this partial reopening of our borders will revive businesses and boost the economies of both countries. Pray that it will be done safely and sustainably, with vigilance and adherence to clear guidelines, for the protection of travellers and the avoidance of community transmission.

#### Thanksgiving for Bishop Rennis (30 Aug)

Thank God for Bp Rennis' 8 years of dedicated and sacrificial service to our Lord as our Diocesan Bishop; for his pastoral shepherding, His Spirit-empowered leadership, for the many significant gifts He has brought to our Diocese and the strong foundation he has laid for future generations. Pray that God will renew his strength as he enters a new season of life and ministry, in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Each Service will be for about an hour. Worshippers may attend individually or in groups of not more than 5 each.

#### ADMISSION

Please book your preferred date and time of Service; only worshippers who book may be admitted into the Services.

Worshippers can do this online at cathedral.org.sg/cws or phone 63376104. Bookings open at 1pm, a week before the day of the Service (eg. booking for a Sunday Service on 30 August will be open at 1pm on Sunday,23 August), and close at 1pm a day before the Service. For Services in Mandarin please call 63392435. Walkins will not be allowed entry.

### PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICULAR ENTRY & EXIT

If you are coming to the Cathedral on foot, use the MRT Gate (the pedestrian gate next to the Cathedral Café) for entry and exit.

#### If you are driving,

enter by the SRC Gate (the vehicular gate facing the Singapore Recreation Centre) and exit by the Padang Gate. Worshippers may park their vehicles in the allocated parking space.

# Please arrive early, but not earlier than 30 minutes before the start of a Service.

Worshippers (and their vehicles) must leave the church premises not later than 30 minutes after the Service ends.

#### For weekday Services,

worshippers will enter the Nave by the North Transept Door and exit by the 2 doors leading to the North and South Transepts.

#### For weekend Services,

the first 50 worshippers will enter by the North Transept Door and be seated in the Upper Nave (pews in the front of the Nave). They will exit by the 2 doors leading into the North and South Transepts. The other 50 worshippers will enter by the West Door and be seated in the Lower Nave (pews at the back of the Nave). They will exit by the same door.

#### SAFE ENTRY

# 2 Safe Entry stations are located at the MRT Gate and the Tent next to the Nave. Proceed to either one and ...

1) Present your **e-ticket**. Your attendance will be time-stamped.

- 2) Have your **temperature taken**. If it is 37.5 degrees C or lower,
- 3) Check-in using **Safe Entry** QR Code, Singpass or NRIC/FIN.

#### **COVID-19 PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES\*:**

#### Masks

must be worn at all times, except when communicants are partaking of the bread and wine.

#### Mingling

Worshippers are reminded not to mingle before and after each Service, and to leave the church premises promptly after the end of the Service. The gates will be closed 30 minutes after the end of each Service.

#### Seniors (70 years and older)

are not yet encouraged to come to church to attend Services. They are advised to join in the Cathedral's weekly on-line Services. They can also contact the pastoral team of their Services to request for Holy Communion to be administered to them at home.

#### **PRIVATE WORSHIP**

#### DAILY, FROM 10AM TO 4PM

Except on Mondays, Saturdays and Sundays, worshippers may enter the Nave for personal prayer, individually or in groups of not more than 5 each.

#### **BOOKING A PRAYER SESSION**

Each session is for 30 minutes, starting on the hour. Please phone 63376014 to book an appointment. Subject to availability, walk-ins may be permitted.

#### **ENTRY INTO THE CATHEDRAL**

All will enter the Cathedral premises by the MRT Gate (next to the Welcome Centre / Café). There will be no entry to vehicles; drivers are advised to park their cars in the carparks outside the church.



# SAC RESTORATION WORKS PROJECT, 2020-2022



Project aims to This repair and restore various parts of the Cathedral's historic building that succumbed have environmental wear and Restoration tear. The Works will involve re-plastering and painting of interior and exterior walls, timber carpentry, stone works, metal works, electrical

works, plumbing and roof works. The Project is expected to take 3 years. The cost of \$6million will be paid out from the Cathedral Heritage Fund (CHF) set up to fund this Project as well as future heritage and building works.
