ast Sunday's Thanksgiving Service for the end of Bishop Rennis Ponniah's stint as the head of our Anglican Church was indeed moving. We have much to celebrate as it was a good eight years of ministry where he imparted and exemplified what it means to live for Christ. Pastoral, caring and priestly in mediating the presence

of God, I have personally been richly blessed and benefitted much.

While most will apply the usual "KPIs" in good Singaporean fashion, to measure the work and worth of a minister, sometimes some of the best fruits are the least obvious. If my past 5 years or so in the Cathedral can be





considered fruitful, I will attribute it in no small measure to the godly and encouraging influence of my bishop. He wears his Christian values and priorities on his sleeves and I didn't need to double guess as to what is right to do in the life and ministry of the Cathedral.

The same can be said for many parishes and often the work of the Bishop is seen in the life of the parish community. As always, the expectations are high across the board, and these include the deaneries, hospitals and schools. And then there is always Communion and Provincial work. The role of the Anglican Church in the affair of the nations has also risen and became demanding in recent years. Every corner of our parishes will want to exact a pound of attention from our dear bishop and like him and his predecessors, the work of the bishop is not easy nor humanly possible.

Coming to the Cathedral, I think some of the best work is unseen and understood only by astute observers. Both our fulltime and lay leadership could do what they did because we






knew we had a godly bishop who was providing the spiritual covering and encouragement. Some areas indeed needed some serious "heavy lifting" work and breakthroughs or progress would not have been possible without him and of course, as always, God's grace undergirds all that we are able to accomplish in His name.

It has been a wonderful stint and I feel an immense privilege to be able to serve at the Cathedral under his watch and trust in his closing years.

We continue to pray for Bishop-designate Revd Canon Dr Titus Chung as he prepares to helm the work and ministry. It will be a new season. As always, may "He increase and we decrease", as we recall the life mission statement of John the Baptist (John 3:30). Indeed, as priests, our life goal is to mediate the presence and purposes of His Kingdom.

May He continue to be glorified.

PRAYER HIGHLIGHTS



THE WORLD

According to the United Nations Children's Fund, coronavirus-related starvation is leading to the worldwide death of 10.000 children a month, 50% of which are in Sub-Sahara Africa. In addition 550,000 children a month are experiencing malnutrition resulting in spindly limbs and distended stomachs. In the long term mass-malnutrition could lead to generations of physically and mentally impaired people. Pray that the plight of these starving and malnourished children will not be overlooked even as governments grapple with the COVID-19 situation in their respective nations. Pray that urgent international aid will be poured in to help the poor nations and for governments as well as humanitarian agencies to act speedily in ensuring that food supplies reach the starving children, especially those in rural villages.

SINGAPORE

Pray for good and robust discussions during our Parliamentary sessions, with constructive and insightful contributions from Members of Parliament. Pray that our Ministers will have divine wisdom as they consider different viewpoints in their decision making and policy formulation. Pray that our people will continue to work with our government, to stabilise the economy, adapt to changes, create new jobs, upskill and reskill workers and care for the needs of the vulnerable in our community.

DIOCESE

Chapel of the Holy Spirit

Pray for the Vicar Revd Michael Teh, priests, pastoral staff and leaders of Chapel of the Holy Spirit that they will discern God's heart and mind for His church in these unprecedented and challenging times; they will be empowered to reach out to the flock and minister to them in creative and effective ways; that the church family will draw closer together and remain strong in faith, powerful in prayer and united in spirit. ADMISSION

Please book your preferred date and time of Service; only worshippers who book may be admitted into the Services.

Bookings open at 1pm, a week before the day of the Service (eg. booking for a Sunday Service on 30 August will be open at 1pm on Sunday,23 August), and close at 1pm a day before the Service. For Services in Mandarin please call 63392435. Walkins will not be allowed entry.

PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICULAR ENTRY & EXIT

If you are coming to the Cathedral on foot, use the MRT Gate (the pedestrian gate next to the Cathedral Café) for entry and exit.

If you are driving,

enter by the SRC Gate (the vehicular gate facing the Singapore Recreation Centre) and exit by the Padang Gate. Worshippers may park their vehicles in the allocated parking space.

Please arrive early, but not earlier than 30 minutes before the start of a Service.

Worshippers (and their vehicles) must leave the church premises not later than 30 minutes after the Service ends.

For weekday Services,

worshippers will enter the Nave by the North Transept Door and exit by the 2 doors leading to the North and South Transepts.

For weekend Services,

the first 50 worshippers will enter by the North Transept Door and be seated in the Upper Nave (pews in the front of the Nave). They will exit by the 2 doors leading into the North and South Transepts. The other 50 worshippers will enter by the West Door and be seated in the Lower Nave (pews at the back of the Nave). They will exit by the same door.

SAFE ENTRY

- 2 Safe Entry stations are located at the MRT Gate and the Tent next to the Nave. Proceed to either one and ...
- 1) Present your **e-ticket**. Your attendance will be time-stamped.
- 2) Have your **temperature taken**. If it is 37.5 degrees C or lower,
- 3) Check-in using **Safe Entry** QR Code, Singpass or NRIC/FIN.







Project aims to This repair and restore various parts of the Cathedral's historic building that succumbed have environmental wear and Restoration tear. The Works will involve re-plastering and painting of interior and exterior walls, timber carpentry, stone works, metal works, electrical

works, plumbing and roof works. The Project is expected to take 3 years. The cost of \$6million will be paid out from the Cathedral Heritage Fund (CHF) set up to fund this Project as well as future heritage and building works.
