THE BASES FROM WHICH WE BUILD

Ve have been exploring the closing chapters of the Book of Romans. The Christian virtues of love, humility, loyalty, sacrifice and purity are foundational to life. Whether it is in the COVID-19 or in other seasons, they act as bases which we never ever depart from. When we sometimes lose our way through the fog of life's confusion or the heat of her trials, returning to these can help us to steady our spiritual anchor. Indeed, this is a season where I have to return to these bases again and again.

Let me pause to say that I have been privileged to serve in the Cathedral for these past 5 years or so. I came reluctantly because



it needed a letting go of some previous visions in my former parish and deep friendships forged. Soon after assuming my responsibilities in SAC, the calling of being a "spiritual father" takes over as naturally as one assumes the role of an earthly father. We plunged into a new community and the usual instincts and sense of behind led by a work of God; larger than any of ourselves; took over.

While what can be seen are the usual icons such as the Bells, Café or Pavilion, some of the most important aspects of life and ministry in SAC are unseen. They took a lot out of me but strangely, also life-giving and replenishing

as pastoral work normally is. Sometimes people assume that the Vicar has "no time" but I do have 24 hours of it every day. I have found the time for my hobbies (such as cooking and writing about it). I don't compartmentalise my life as I always see everything as integral to my calling and being.

The Cathedral is of course prominent and visible place and it can experience a measure of intrique. But at the heart, she is just another church and a church was what I endeavoured to serve and build with His grace. A church prays, loves, witnesses, fellowships, grows and so on. That was it and I trust will always be. One previous bishop said that sometimes God gives us toys to play with but they do not last nor will they be remembered. There were certain "toys" along the way but they should not detract from the essential work of helping




men and women to follow God and discover their destiny and calling.

If you have grown in Christ these past years and can attribute to some measure to the SAC community, that will indeed be a point for rejoicing. If you have made friends, remember that these things will last for eternity.

Love, humility, purity and loyalty. May these Christ-like virtues continue to be the foundation from which we build our lives.



PRAYER HIGHLIGHTS



THE WORLD Japan, South & North Korea

Pray for the governments of Japan, South and North Korea in their recovery, rebuilding and restorative efforts, after the massive devastation caused by typhoons Maysak and Haishen in the past weeks. Pray for the flood waters to recede speedily, for rescue teams to find survivors, for the injured to recover, for those who have lost their homes to be fed and sheltered. Pray for good organization and resources to rebuild properties that have been destroyed; restore power to hundreds of thousands of homes, resume operations for different modes of transportation and re-open factories, schools and businesses. Pray also for success in rescuing missing persons from ships which had capsized during the typhoons.

SINGAPORE

Thank God that the rate of COVID-19 infections in Singapore is slowing down with fewer number of reported cases. Pray that workers will comply with safety management measures in their work sites, to maintain a healthy working environment for all and that further effective measures will be taken to prevent the resurgence of community transmission within our migrant worker dormitories.

Pray also for God's merciful intervention to stop the ongoing dengue transmissions in 308 active clusters, which has resulted in more than 28,000 infections and 20 deaths this year.

DIOCESE

Bishop Designate Revd Canon Dr Titus Chung

Thank God for our past Bishops who have shepherded the Diocesan flock. Pray that their legacy will continue under Bp. Designate Revd Canon Dr Titus Chung; that God continue to give Bp. Designate Titus a spirit of wisdom, counsel, and compassion, that he may discern God's will for our Diocese and be empowered for his new role. Pray also for God's continued favour upon him, his wife Connie and their two sons, Theodore and Thaddeus, strengthen and protect them and grant them His peace, keep them safe and fill them with His joy.

Marine Parade Christian Centre

Pray for Rev. Joseph You as he provides spiritual leadership and pastoral care for members of MPCC in his capacity as Acting Vicar. Pray that members will be able to adjust to the leadership transition. Pray that the Church will remain strong in the Lord, refreshed by His love and empowered by His grace as they unite to advance God's Kingdom and fulfill the Great Commission.

My Savior's Church

Pray for the Vicar Rev Charles Tewer and his team as they provide oversight for the Church. Pray for the smooth integration and growth of the church's English congregation. ADMISSION

Please book your preferred date and time of Service; only worshippers who book may be admitted into the Services.

Worshippers can do this online at <u>cathedral.org.sg/cws</u> or phone 63376104. Bookings open at 1pm, a week before the day of the Service (eg. booking for a Sunday Service on 30 August will be open at 1pm on Sunday,23 August), and close at 1pm a day before the Service. For Services in Mandarin please call 63392435. Walkins will not be allowed entry.

PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICULAR ENTRY & EXIT

If you are coming to the Cathedral on foot, use the MRT Gate (the pedestrian gate next to the Cathedral Café) for entry and exit.

If you are driving,

enter by the SRC Gate (the vehicular gate facing the Singapore Recreation Centre) and exit by the Padang Gate. Worshippers may park their vehicles in the allocated parking space.

Please arrive early, but not earlier than 30 minutes before the start of a Service.

Worshippers (and their vehicles) must leave the church premises not later than 30 minutes after the Service ends.

For weekday Services,

worshippers will enter the Nave by the North Transept Door and exit by the 2 doors leading to the North and South Transepts.

For weekend Services,

the first 50 worshippers will enter by the North Transept Door and be seated in the Upper Nave (pews in the front of the Nave). They will exit by the 2 doors leading into the North and South Transepts. The other 50 worshippers will enter by the West Door and be seated in the Lower Nave (pews at the back of the Nave). They will exit by the same door.

SAFE ENTRY

- 2 Safe Entry stations are located at the MRT Gate and the Tent next to the Nave.
 Proceed to either one and ...
- 1) Present your **e-ticket**. Your attendance will be time-stamped.
- 2) Have your **temperature taken**. If it is 37.5 degrees C or lower,
- 3) Check-in using **Safe Entry** QR Code, Singpass or NRIC/FIN.

must be worn at all times, except when communicants are partaking of the bread and wine.

Mingling

Worshippers are reminded not to mingle before and after each Service, and to leave the church premises promptly after the end of the Service. The gates will be closed 30 minutes after the end of each Service.

Seniors (70 years and older)

Father Revd Joshua Raj

are not yet encouraged to come to church to attend Services. They are advised to join in the Cathedral's weekly on-line Services. They can also contact the pastoral team of their Services to request for Holy Communion to be administered to them at home.

Except on Mondays, Saturdays and Sundays, worshippers may enter the Nave for personal prayer, individually or in groups of not more than 5 each.

SAC RESTORATION WORKS PROJECT, 2020-2022



This Project aims to repair and restore various parts of the Cathedral's historic building that succumbed have environmental wear and tear. The Restoration Works will involve re-plastering and repainting of interior and exterior walls, timber carpentry, stone works, metal works, electrical

works, plumbing and roof works. The Project is expected to take 3 years. The cost of \$6million will be paid out from the Cathedral Heritage Fund (CHF) set up to fund this Project as well as future heritage and building works.


