We have been exploring the closing chapters of the Book of Romans. The Christian virtues of love, humility, loyalty, sacrifice and purity are foundational to life. as pastoral work normally is. Sometimes people assume that the Vicar has "no time" but I do have 24 hours of it every day. I have found the time for my hobbies (such as cooking and writing about it). I don't compartmentalise my life as I always see everything as integral to my calling and being.

The Cathedral is of course a prominent and visible place and it can experience a measure of intrigue. But at the heart, she is just another church and a church was what I endeavoured to serve and build with His grace. A church prays, loves, witnesses, fellowships, grows and so on. That was it and I trust will always be. One previous bishop said that sometimes God gives us toys to play with but they do not last nor will they be remembered. There were certain "toys" along the way but they should not detract from the essential work of helping



men and women to follow God and discover their destiny and calling.

If you have grown in Christ these past years and can attribute to some measure to the SAC community, that will indeed be a point for rejoicing. If you have made friends, remember that these things will last for eternity.

Love, humility, purity and loyalty. May these Christ-like virtues continue to be the foundation from which we build our lives.
