Bishop-Designate Titus, in preparing the Diocese for a new season, has just made some important announcements about multiple clergy and deaconess postings. In due course, we will let you know the full list of postings, including some which will affect our extension centre, Westside Anglican Church.

I will share here a few which affect the Cathedral directly.

On the 1st of January 2021, I will be posted out to serve as the Vicar of Marine Parade Christian Centre. Deaconess Bessie Lee will move to St John's-St Margaret's Church (SJSJ). Revd Hambali Leonardi will move to

Church of the Ascension, and Revd Calvin Wee to St Hilda's Church.

On 1st December 2020, Revd Lewis Lew, who is the current dean of Nepal, will be posted from SJSJ to St Andrew's Cathedral as the Vicar-Designate.

On the 1st of January 2021, Revd Christopher Chan from Chapel of the Resurrection (COR) and Revd Daniel Lim from Church of the Ascension will be posted to SAC.

For those who are familiar with the nature of our Anglican Church, bishop's initiated postings of clergy and deaconesses are a norm. They

sometimes happen in dribs and drabs but it can also be sweeping as a new bishop seeks to refresh and revitalise the flock. Our Bishop-designate, in his own words, has said that this is done prayerfully and with careful consultation.

As each of us is serving the Lord through serving in His Church, we will always be ready to go if there is a call to serve in any part of His vineyard.

We will get to share more about this as we plan the transition. With the

parting of ways, there will be of course a certain level of grief as a pastor-member relationship can be familial, deep and strong, in tandem with a pastor's length of service in a particular community. We will need to give room for some measure of relational closures and events will be organised for these.

Some may wonder, being in a pandemic season, if this is a good time to change. Given the nature of this pandemic, I doubt that we can find a "good time." As the church, relatively speaking, is in a standstill or moving at a much slower pace, one can say it is easier for leadership changes to be made. Be assured that both those who are outgoing and incoming will continue to work closely to lead and guide SAC with the rest of her current leadership, both staff and lay, as we navigate through a season of change where society is in a state of flux.

Do continue to pray for our new Bishop and those of us who are involved in the new postings.

PRAYER HIGHLIGHTS



THE WORLD

United States

Deadly wildfires raging across the states of Oregon, California and Washington in the West Coast of America have burnt nearly 5 million acres, destroyed thousands of homes and killed 33 people. . Scientists say that global warming has contributed to extremes in wet and dry seasons causing vegetation to flourish and then dry out, leaving abundant fuel for wildfires. Pray for those who lost their homes and loved ones to be cared for and comforted, for the safety of those who are potentially at risk, for the preservation of about 20,000 firefighters who are battling the blazes and for God's merciful intervention to put an end to this catastrophe. Pray that the U.S. government will act with speed and wisdom to help the affected people through this crisis; and that they will give priority together with global partners, to addressing the urgent issues of global warming and climate change.

SINGAPORE

COVID-19 has accelerated the use of innovation and technology to address the challenges of the pandemic. Pray for our government as they work with deep tech firms to "tap the potential of artificial intelligence to speed up the development of vaccines and capitalize on this growth area for economic competitiveness in the long term" (Minister S. Iswaran). Pray also for businesses to successfully re-invent themselves, harnessing technology to meet the

shift in consumer demand for more healthcare products, and to preserve jobs. Pray that those who have been retrenched will be guided to, and be reskilled for, new job opportunities.

DIOCESE

Bishop Designate Revd Canon Dr Titus Chung

Pray for a smooth changeover as Bp-Designate Revd Canon Titus Chung takes on the mantle as Bishop of the Diocese of Singapore on 18 October; for the Committee planning the Consecration and Enthronement Service, to be divinely guided that the Service will be well organized, meaningfully stitched together and the proceedings will run smoothly within the constraints of COVID-19. Pray also that the Lord's presence will fill the entire Cathedral on 18 Oct, that His love and grace will abound and His Holy Spirit will be poured out upon Bp-Designate Titus Chung, to empower him for his new role, that God's glory will be manifest in his life and ministry. Pray also for his wife Connie and two sons, Theodore and Thaddeus to be strengthened as they walk this journey with him.

St Paul's Church

Pray for the Vicar Rev Jeremy Ponniah and the leadership team that they may have the Lord's wisdom and empowering to shepherd the flock in St Paul's Church; for the growth and development of the youth ministry and for the raising up of new youth leaders. Pray also for the management committee of St Paul's Church kindergarten that they will have the Lord's counsel, as they explore the viability of operating as a Childcare Centre.

Online DCBS (OT Module 7 & NT Module 13)

Pray for the instructors as they wait on the Lord and prepare themselves to teach His word in this new term; for those who are new to online teaching to adapt well to this new mode of instruction and for God's anointing to teach His word with clarity. ADMISSION

Please book your preferred date and time of Service; only worshippers who book may be admitted into the Services.

Worshippers can do this online at cathedral.org.sg/cws or phone 63376104. Bookings open at 1pm, a week before the day of the Service (eg. booking for a Sunday Service on 30 August will be open at 1pm on Sunday, 23 August), and close at 1pm a day before the Service. For Services in Mandarin please call 63392435. Walk-ins will not be allowed entry.

PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICULAR ENTRY & EXIT

If you are coming to the Cathedral on foot, use the MRT Gate (the pedestrian gate next to the Cathedral Café) for entry and exit.

If you are driving,

enter by the SRC Gate (the vehicular gate facing the Singapore Recreation Centre) and exit by the Padang Gate. Worshippers may park their vehicles in the allocated parking space.

Please arrive early, but not earlier than 30 minutes before the start of a Service.

Worshippers (and their vehicles) must leave the church premises not later than 30 minutes after the Service ends.

For weekday Services,

worshippers will enter the Nave by the North Transept Door and exit by the 2 doors leading to the North and South Transepts.

For weekend Services,

the first 50 worshippers will enter by the North Transept Door and be seated in the Upper Nave (pews in the front of the Nave). They will exit by the 2 doors leading into the North and South Transepts. The other 50 worshippers will enter by the West Door and be seated in the Lower Nave (pews at the back of the Nave). They will exit by the same door.

SAFE ENTRY

2 Safe Entry stations are located at the MRT Gate and the Tent next to the Nave.

Proceed to either one and ...

- 1) Present your **e-ticket**. Your attendance will be time-stamped.
- 2) Have your **temperature taken**. If it is 37.5 degrees C or lower,
- 3) Check-in using **Safe Entry** QR Code, Singpass or NRIC/FIN.

COVID-19 PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES*:

Masks

must be worn at all times, except when communicants are partaking of the bread and wine.

Mingling

Worshippers are reminded not to mingle before and after each Service, and to leave the church premises promptly after the end of the Service. The gates will be closed 30 minutes after the end of each Service.

PRIVATE WORSHIP

DAILY, FROM 10AM TO 4PM

Except on Mondays, Saturdays and Sundays, worshippers may enter the Nave for personal prayer, individually or in groups of not more than 5 each.

BOOKING A PRAYER SESSION

Each session is for 30 minutes, starting on the hour. Please phone 63376014 to book an appointment. Subject to availability, walk-ins may be permitted.

ENTRY INTO THE CATHEDRAL

All will enter the Cathedral premises by the MRT Gate (next to the Welcome Centre / Café). There will be no entry to vehicles; drivers are advised to park their cars in the carparks outside the church.

SAC RESTORATION WORKS PROJECT, 2020-2022



This Project aims to repair and restore various parts of the Cathedral's historic building that have succumbed to environmental wear and tear. The Restoration Works will involve re-plastering and re-painting of interior and exterior walls, timber carpentry, stone works, metal works, electrical

works, plumbing and roof works. The Project is expected to take 3 years. The cost of \$6million will be paid out from the Cathedral Heritage Fund (CHF) set up to fund this Project as well as future heritage and building works.
