LEADING

e have 300+ who have signed up for our upcoming AGM. There will be a "contest" for the Parochial Church Council (PCC) seats as we have 15 brothers and sisters who have offered to serve for 12 seats. Some are already serving in the current PCC. Do pray about who you would want to vote to serve in the 2020-2021 term. This time round, we are also electing four Synod Representatives. In last week's bulletin, we have shared in detail the role of the Synod Representatives. When elected, Synod Reps will serve in our PCC for three years. There is no contest for the People Warden's position but the candidate will still need to obtain a minimum of 30% of those present to be elected.

Let me share a bit about the role of the wardens. They work closely with the Vicar, forming an inner circle which provides for ease of connection, confidential sharing on issues, close consultation and channelling communication the congregation, Vicar and Bishop. PCC remains the supreme body which the Vicar and wardens will report back to. Wardens are also expected to be accessible by the Bishop and this is important to establish a network of accountability and feedback. Religious authority can sometimes be abused (or perceived as such by members) and feedback will be helpful for the Vicar's self-awareness, or in cases where there is a serious breakdown of relationship, the Bishop or other diocesan



HOW GOOD AND PLEASANT IT IS WHEN GOD'S PEOPLE LIVE TOGETHER IN UNITY! PSALM 133:1 senior officials can help to mediate. The converse is also true as some members may sometimes put undue pressure on the Vicar or other clergy and the wardens can help to mediate.

We have the Vicar's Warden, who is appointed by the Vicar, and the People's Warden who is elected by the congregation. This has evolved into the idea that "the Vicar's Warden protects the Vicar and the People's Warden, the people." This may seem intuitive but traditionally, both wardens actually play the same role in serving with the Vicar and the congregation. The title merely refers to how he was appointed/elected.

No system is perfect and at the end of the day, it is good Christian sense and maturity that govern how a church community functions. From time to time, there will be disagreements, not unlike the incident in Acts 6. The challenge for any church is not to stifle all disagreements but to learn to manage

them in a way which is constructive. I do try my best, by

His grace, to exemplify how I discharge my Vicar's role by being open, accessible and offer a listening ear for constructive criticism and feedback. And I hope that all those entrusted with authority will do likewise so that together, we can create a culture of open accountability and do our best to keep our community healthy and Christlike. Heart to heart conversations are never overrated, through Zoom or otherwise! Indeed our witness to the world depends very much on how we love one other, as Jesus has foretold and taught (John 13:35). We are reminded in our liturgy constantly to "love God and neighbour." If we seek to do this well, our influence and witness as a Church will be strong and Christ-glorifying.

I want to thank both the wardens and PCC for serving with me in this challenging season. I also would like to take this opportunity to announce that I am reappointing Keith Chua as the Vicar's Warden.

Instead, you will be required to submit a completed Proxy Voting Form, through which you are appointing the Chairman of the AGM (the Vicar) as your proxy to attend, speak and vote at the AGM. Your proxy form will also contain specific instructions with regards to voting or abstentions in relation to a particular resolution. Your proxy vote, once submitted and received, would also count towards the quorum for the AGM.

ER members who have registered for the AGM will be receiving the link to the Proxy Voting Form on 16 June via email.

The Proxy Voting Form will be open for submission on 17 June until 2359h, 25 June 2020. Please note that no forms can be accepted past the deadline.

SAC RESTORATION WORKS PROJECT, 2020-2022



This Project aims to repair and restore various parts of the Cathedral's historic building that succumbed have environmental wear and tear. The Restoration Works will involve re-plastering and repainting of interior and exterior walls, timber carpentry, stone works, metal works, electrical

works, plumbing and roof works. The Project is expected to take 3 years. The cost of \$6million will be paid out from the Cathedral Heritage Fund (CHF) set up to fund this Project as well as future heritage and building works.

In this Covid-19 pandemic, we are encouraged to know that various members and groups in the Cathedral have gone out of their way to bring tangible relief to others in their difficulty. This Zoom meeting will be organized for us to hear them share their experiences.

The meeting will also provide do-able opportunities for all to join these groups in the Cathedral's outreach work.

HAPPY HANDS

A group volunteers at a local soup kitchen to provide more than 6,000 meals each



day. There are 2 aspects to this work:

 preparing the meals in the kitchen (washing, cutting, chopping, cooking and packing)

2. delivering the meals to the poor and needy

Volunteers can choose the day, time and frequency for serving.



BEFRIENDING MIGRANT WORKERS

During the Circuit Breaker period, supporters and volunteers had provided and delivered **fruits packs*** and snacks/ care packs to an average of 7400 workers

in up to 64 dormitories, weekly. In Phase 1, we continue providing this relief to about 4000 workers in 43 dormitories.

The BMW English
Tuition Programme
is an additional
on-line effort that
reaches Indian
and Bangladeshi



workers in their dormitories by providing conversational English lessons. Each session is for 30 minutes and it is done via WhatsApp video. An average speaker of English will be able to make use of



the lesson plans and conduct the sessions from home. Volunteers, especially men are needed for this work.



LAZARUS MINISTRY

On Friday nights (8.30pm – 12midnight), members pair up to walk about the civic district (areas around the Cathedral) to befriend the homeless and to provide rough sleepers with help and support. This Ministry is also looking to organize itself to reach the lonely elderly living in HDB rental flats.

ACTS OF KINDNESS

Individuals from St Andrew's offer their time and resources to support professional social workers in their case work of caring for the needy. This support is for a fixed term and it is mostly in the form of supplying groceries or supplies vouchers to disadvantaged families and children at risk.
